Question 1

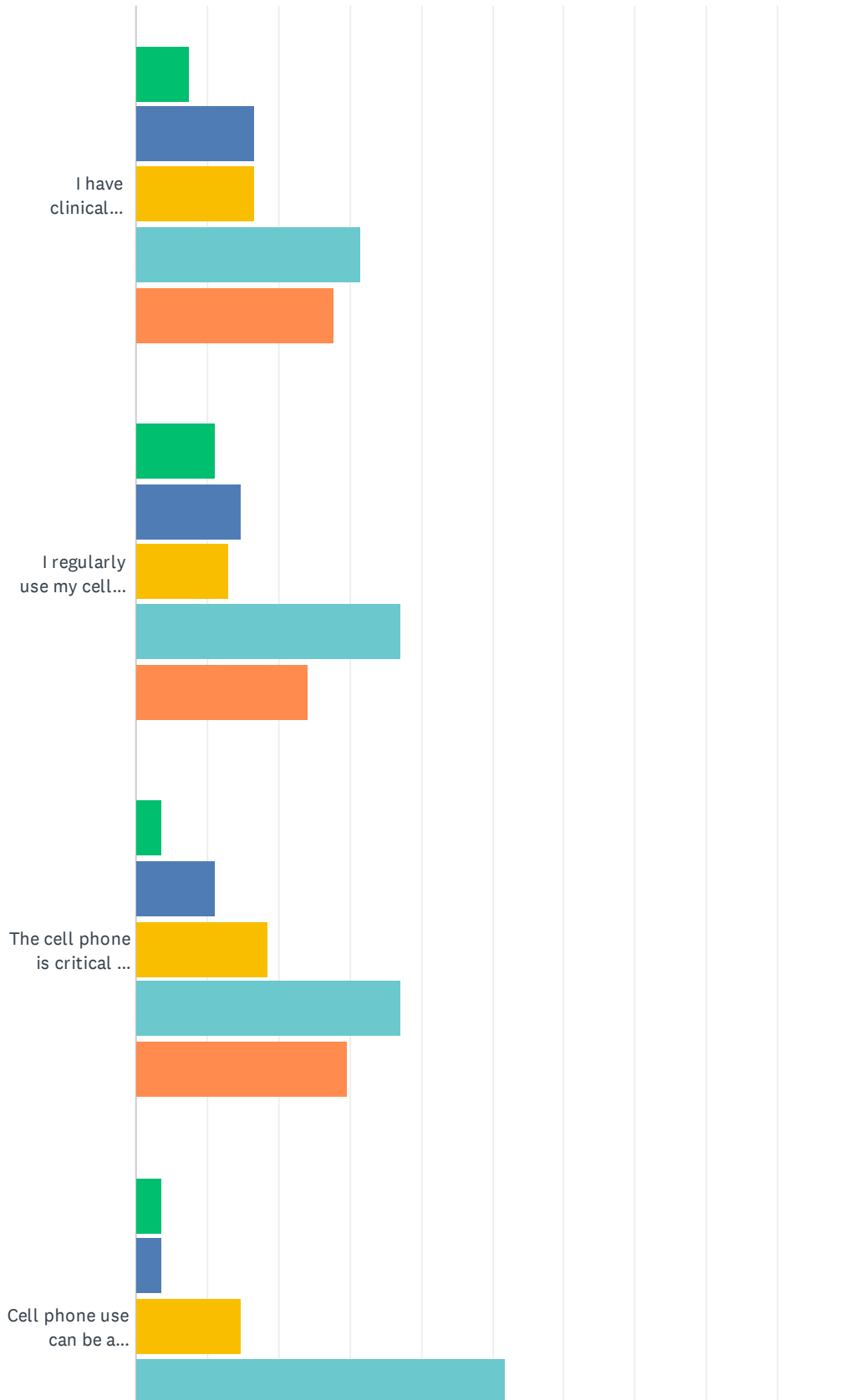
- The majority felt that cell phones were important clinically or for personal emergency access. A greater majority felt that the cell phones were a distraction in the workplace but felt the pharmacy team members, particularly pharmacists, should have access to them:
 - I regularly use clinical resources on my cell phone – 59% Agree or Strongly Agree
 - I regularly use my cell phone to connect with healthcare colleagues for work related matters – 61% Agree or Strongly Agree
 - My cell phone is critical in case I need to be contacted for an emergency for personal/family matters – 67% Agree or Strongly Agree
 - Cell phones can be a distraction that decrease efficiency in some workers – 78% Agree or Strongly Agree
 - Everyone on the team should have access to their cell phone – 50% Agree or Strongly Agree
 - Pharmacists should have access to their cell phone – 85% Agree or Strongly Agree

Comments

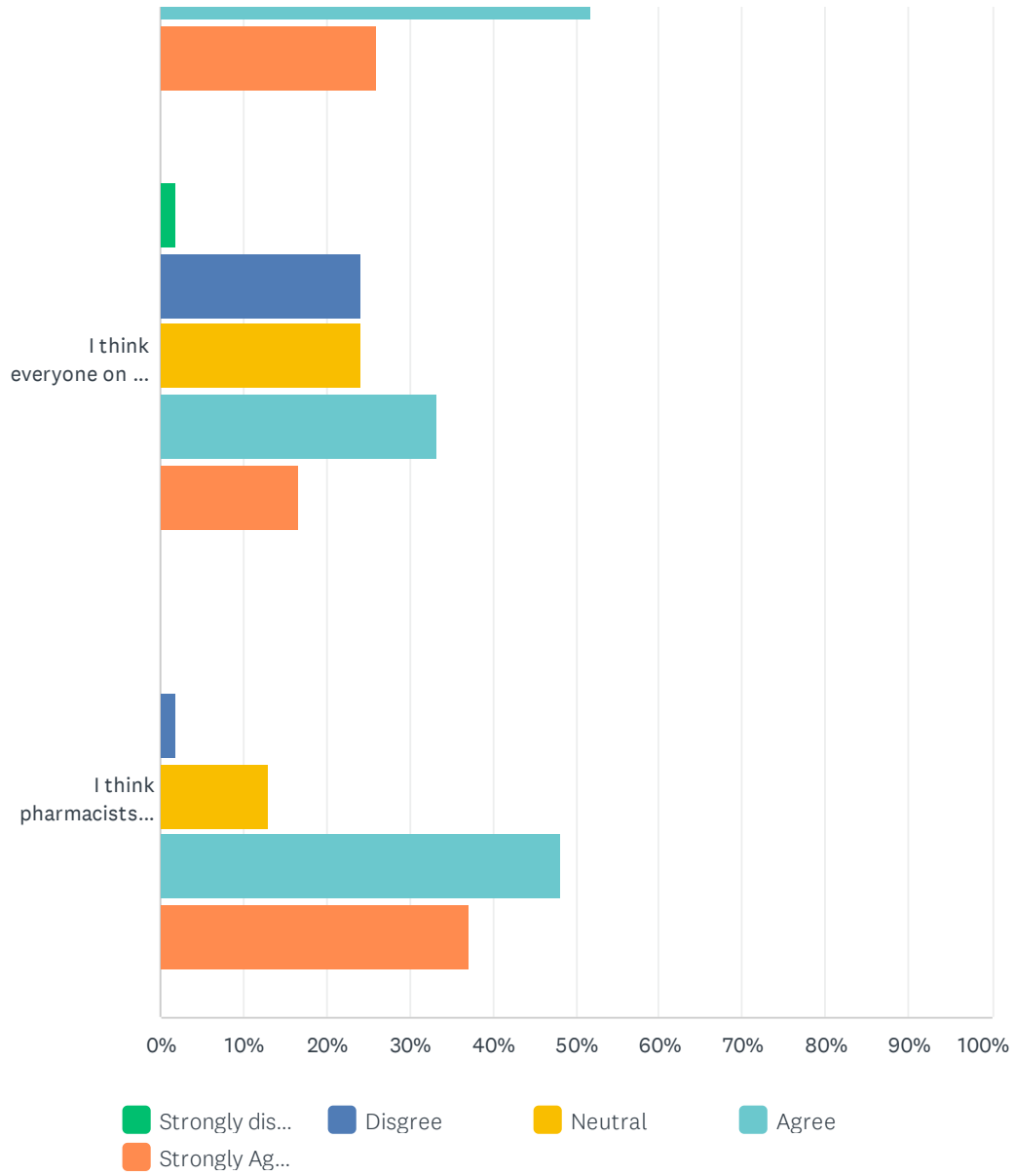
- Flip phone ok, Smart phone not okay (I do not own a smart phone)

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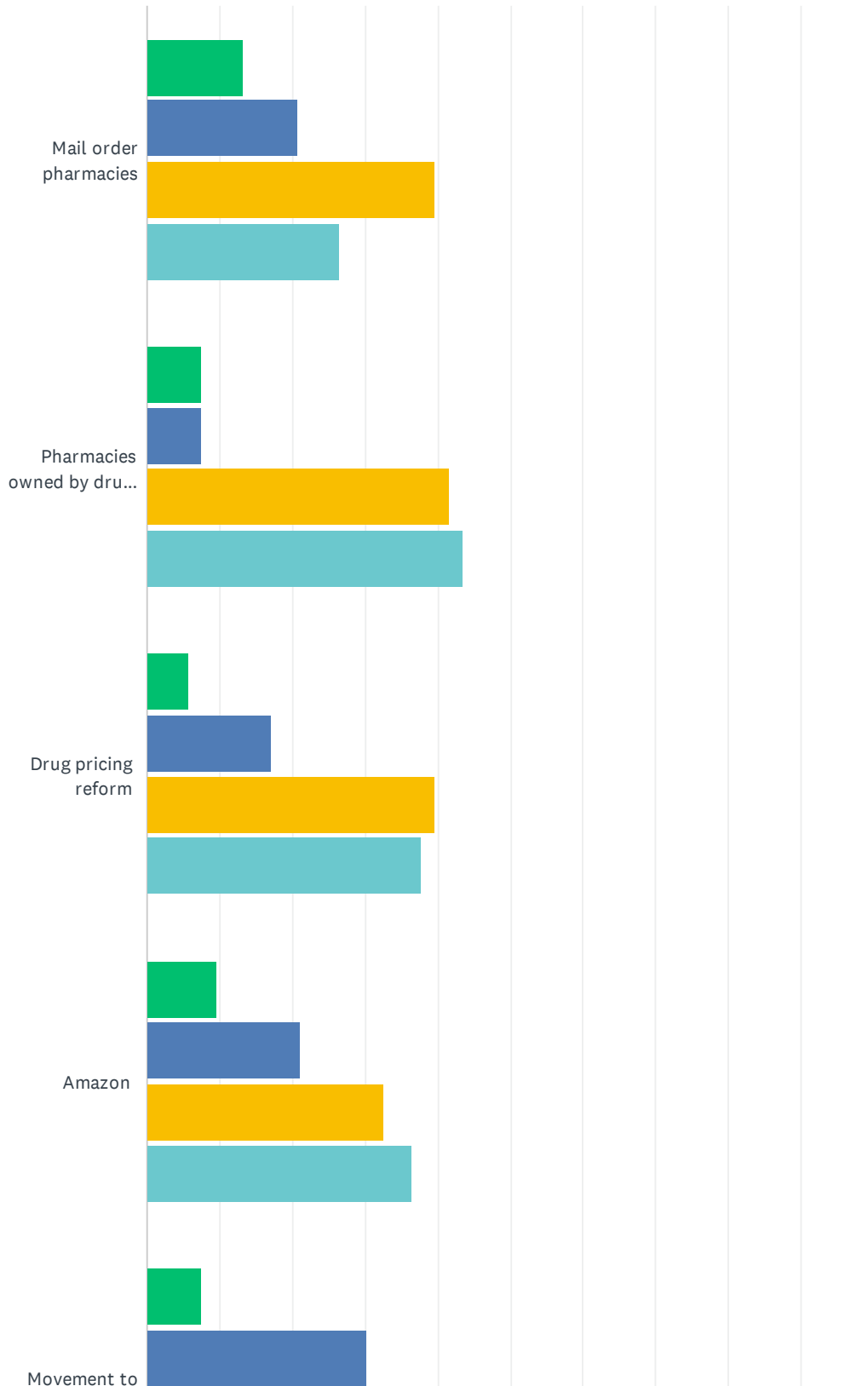


Question 2

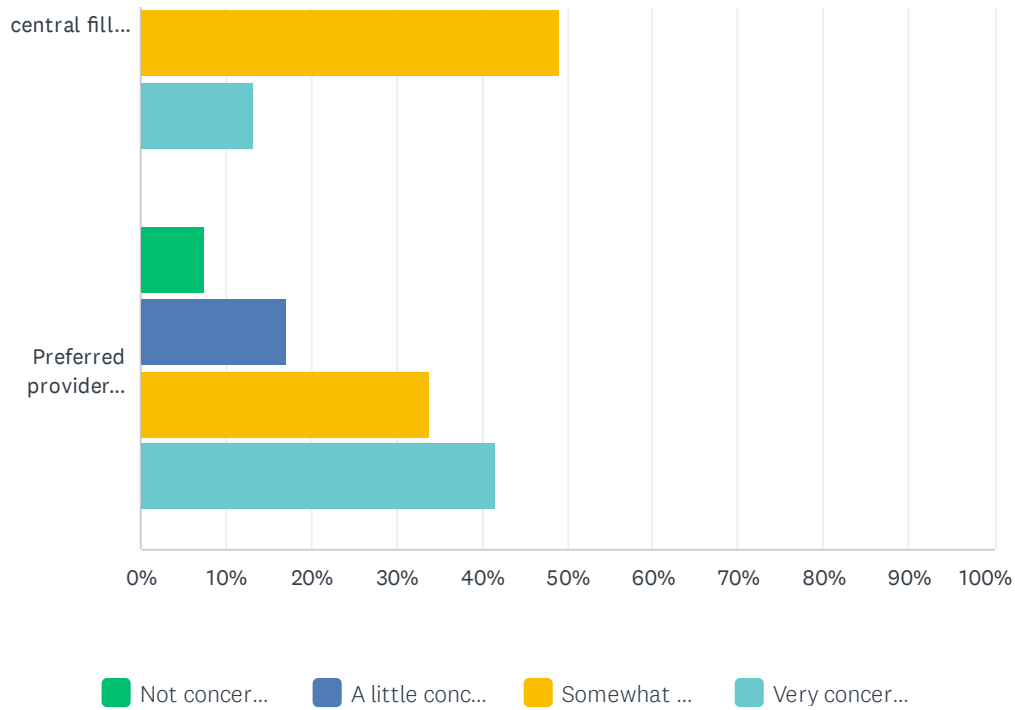
- You can see the results for yourself. In order, from most concern (Somewhat concerned/Very concerned Total) to least concern:

 - Mail order pharmacies - 66%
 - Central fill for all prescriptions – 62%
