RE: COVID-19 Non-Severe Therapy Pharmacist Consult Service

Medications including inhaled budesonide, sotrovimab, and nirmatrelvir/ritonavir (Paxlovid) may be appropriate for patients with early, non-severe COVID-19. Early <u>testing</u>, within 48 hours of mild symptom onset, and <u>reporting of results</u> is vital to facilitate timely eligibility assessment for <u>sotrovimab</u> and <u>nirmatrelvir/ritonavir</u> (Paxlovid). <u>Click here to learn more about COVID-19 early detection</u>.

While these medications are in short supply, only designated prescribers are responsible for sotrovimab and nirmatrelvir/ritonavir (Paxlovid) prescribing for eligible individuals with non-severe COVID-19. Pharmacists collaborate with these designated prescribers to assess for eligibility, identify contraindications and drug-interactions, and to provide patient education.

The COVID-19 Non-Severe Therapy Pharmacist Consult Service was created to enable timely initiation and access to sotrovimab and nirmatrelvir/ritonavir (Paxlovid) across Nova Scotia. The service is provided by NS Health pharmacists that work with the sotrovimab and nirmatrelvir/ritonavir (Paxlovid) designated prescribers.

Healthcare professionals identifying patients who meet the <u>eligibility criteria</u> are encouraged to email <u>COVIDTreatment@nshealth.ca</u>. Practitioners with patients prescribed sotrovimab or nirmatrelvir/ritonavir (Paxlovid) are encouraged to call **1-833-714-2784 between 9 am and 5 pm, 7 days a week** to ask medication or drug interaction questions. Please note this line is intended for health professionals and should not be shared with patients.
